Notes on why Sign up to Safety have created the video

This 'Conversations to help people work safely' video summarises all that the Sign up to Safety team has heard and learned from their work so far, since the campaign launched in June 2014. All along the way they have turned to the members; to ask questions, to listen to what they experience, to learn from what they say, and to involve them as their thinking has evolved. This video reflects on all of that and shares where this has led them, and how that can help you.

The campaign exists to help everyone and anyone who wants to work safely, so that they can do so more effectively themselves, and help others to do so too. The team has come to understand that simply by paying attention to how we talk to each other, we can build the strong and positive relationships that are the foundations on which a safety culture is built.

Regardless of where you work, what you are responsible for or what your job title is, this is relevant to you. This video has been recorded so that you can hear the reasons why talking to each other is so very important, in as easy and quick a format as possible.

The hope is that what they have heard from others also connects with you personally, and that you can see how conversations could help you work more safely.

Some ideas to help you start a conversation about what you've watched

[These open questions can be used with a group after watching the video]

Here are some open questions that can help you start a conversation flowing about what is said in the video and what it means to those watching it with you. Doing so will not only help you connect as a group, but could also help you understand more about each other's experiences and what needs to change to help foster the right culture for safety. Even if you are watching the video on your own, these questions on the following page could help you think it through.

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- What struck you about what was said in the video?
- How does it reflect your personal experience?
- What behaviour from those around you would help you feel safer to speak, really heard and listened to?
- How could your own behaviour better help others feel safe to speak, heard and listened to?
- How do you feel this would help you be safer in your work?
- How could conversations about safety help you gain more understanding and insights to support any specific projects you have underway or planned?
- What (at least) one thing will you do differently now, because of this conversation?
- Who do you think would find this video and questions helpful too?
- How will you share the video and these questions with them?
